Be it duly noted these minutes of April 27, 2020, are UNOFFICIAL minutes.

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 8:30 a.m., with Board members Michael Nolte-Chairman, Gary McVicker and Corey Eberling present.

Chairman Nolte led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves the Agenda as presented with one addition; 1) Dows Junction Cigarette permit. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves the Minutes of April 20, 2020. All ayes. Motion carried.

Committee Updates: Supervisor Eberling reported landowners of DD #68 felt the repairs were completed and the Trustees could release of retainage dollars; Central lowa Juvenile Detention; Board of Health; DECAT Empowerment; Jay Waddingham-County Engineer

At 9:30 a.m., a conference call with Wright County Supervisors was held to accept and grant a bid for repair work proposed in JDD 4-118 Open Ditch and Lateral 2. Said bids were submitted and opened at the March 23, 2020 Board meeting.

Present was: Franklin Supervisors Mike Nolte, Gary McVicker, Corey Eberling; Michelle Giddings, Auditor; Colette Bruns, Drainage Clerk; Via Zoom Lee Gallentine-Drainage Engineer CGA, Wright County Supervisors Karl Helgevold, Rick Rasmussen, Dean Kluss; Betty Ellis, Auditor; Courtney Stewart, Drainage Clerk; Sandy McGrath, Environmental Health and Jeremy Abbas, Assistant to the County Engineer, plus numerous people on Zoom.

Lee Gallentine, Drainage Engineer, explained the bids presented from the March 23, 2020 Board meeting and reported that all numbers and bid bonds were acceptable.

Gallentine stated that a letter was received from NRCS concerning the proposed project and jurisdictional wetlands. The ruling from NRCS is that the project will not impact jurisdictional wetlands.

One landowner expressed his concern of this being a poor time to contract work due to corn prices being so low at this time. Wright County reported they have no direct impact with this repair since all work will be done in Franklin County. To date they have not received any opposition from landowners in Wright County.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Kluss, accepts the bid from Mountain Movers Dirt Work, Rowan, Iowa, for the bid price for repairs in JDD #4-118 Open Ditch

\$262,670.77; and JDD #4-118, Lateral 2 \$72,980; using concrete as the material of choice. All ayes. Motion carried.

The Board asked Lee Gallentine, Drainage Engineer, on the status of completion of work in DD #48 performed by Rognes Brothers, Gallentine stated there are numerous slough areas that need fixing and be it noted these slough areas have not affected the flow of water. Work has not been completed even though the deadline was in 2017 with a six-month extension. The Board directed Gallentine to finish the Completion Report and contact the Bonding Company of Rognes Brothers noting the Punch List has not been completed even though the project completion date is well over two years old. To date the Board is still holding the retainage and performance bond on this project. No formal action was taken.

Gabe Johanns, IT, met to update the Board on remote access for essential County employees. Twenty-five licenses have been purchased and are available to disperse between departments or employees that do not have a County laptop. Once all departments have submitted to Gabe an "Essential Employee List" and a "List of those that would be interested in having the remote access on their personal home computers", then the Board will issue and disperse the licenses accordingly. April 30, 2020 is the deadline to submit these lists to the IT Department.

At 10:30 a.m., a Departmental Meeting was held via Zoom. Discussion was on COVID-19.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves 46 Business Property Tax Credit applications and disallow 1 Business Property Tax Credit application for 2019 as recommended by the Franklin County Assessor. All ayes, motion carried

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves the Food Pantry Lease for calendar year 2020. All ayes, motion carried

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves a Cigarette Permit for Dudley's Corner for the period from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. All ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves a Cigarette Permit for Dows Junction for the period from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. All ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, adjourns at 11:09 a.m., until May 4, 2020. All ayes. Motion carried.

Work on the improvement shall be commenced immediately upon approval of the contract by the Council and be completed as stated below.

Please return the plans and specifications complete and in good usable condition within fourteen (14) days after the award of the project.

By virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to products and provisions grown and coal produced within the State of Iowa, and to Iowa domestic labor, to the extent lawfully required under Iowa statutes

In accordance with lowa statutes, a resident bidder shall be allowed a preference as against a nonresident bidder from a state or foreign country fit hat state or foreign country gives or requires any preference to bidders from that state or foreign country, including but not limited to any preference to bidders, the imposition of any type of labor force preference, or any other form of preferential treatment to bidders or laborers from that state or foreign country. The preference allowed shall be equal to the preference given or required by the state or foreign country.

The bidder's security shall be in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the total amount of the bid, as fixed in the Instruction to bidders and shall be in the form of a cashier's check or a certified check drawn on an FDIC insured bank in Iowa or on an FDIC insured bank chartered under the laws of the United States: or a certified share draft drawn on a credit union in lowa or chartered under the laws of the United States: or a bid bond on the form provided in the contract documents with corporate surety satisfactory to the Jurisdiction. The bid shall contain no condition except as provided in the specifications.

a responsible surety approved by the City of Hampton, Iowa, and shall guarantee the faithful performance of the contract and the terms and conditions therein contained and shall guarantee the prompt payment of all material and labor, and protect and save harmless the City of Hampton, Iowa, from claims and damages of any kind caused by the operations of the contract and shall also guarantee the maintenance of the improvement caused by failures in materials and construction for a period of four (4) years from and after acceptance of the contract. The guaranteed maintenance period for new paying shall be four years.
