NOTICE OF BUTLER COUNTY CITY/SCHOOL ELECTION

Butler County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections, Lizbeth Williams hereby gives Public Notice to the eligible voters of Butler County, Iowa, that the COMBINED CITY AND SCHOOL ELECTION will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 5, 2019. A sample ballot and a list of Candidates is published with this notice.

Voters must vote in their precinct of residence.

Township voters in Butler County will now vote for school board in their General Election Precinct.

Township voters will only be voting for School Board and Community College candidates, if any.

Polling Sites will be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. as follows: (Please read carefully to determine your correct voting location)

 1-GR Community Center, 202 W. South St., Greene (Cities of Aredale and Greene, and Townships of Bennezette, Coldwater, and Dayton)

2-CL Amvet Building, 102 E. Greene St., Clarksville (City of Clarksville, and Townships of Butler, Fremont and Jackson)

3-DU American Legion Hall, 508 Main St., Dumont (City of Dumont and Townships of Madison, Pittsford and Washington)

4-AL Courthouse, Lower Level, 428 Sixth St., Allison (City of Allison and West Point Township)

5-AP Community Center, 927 Parriott St., Aplington (City of Aplington and

Townships of Monroe and Ripley)
 6-SR Boyd Building, 303 S. Cherry St., Shell Rock (City of Shell Rock and Townships of Jefferson and Shell Rock and that part of Beaver Township lying North of 310th St. East of County Road T55)
 7-PB Veterans Memorial Building, 102 Colfax St., Parkersburg (City of Parkersburg and Albion Township)
 8-NH Community Center, 303 Broadway St., New Hartford (City of New Hartford and that part of Beaver Township lying south of 310th St. and west of County Road T55)



Any voter who requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write may be given assistance at the polls by a person of the voter's choice, other than the voter's employer or agent of that employer, or officer or agent of the voter's union. Any voter who is physically unable to enter a polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle.

Voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. In addition, voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on Election Day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence.

A voter who is unable to provide such information 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast

a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by noon, Tuesday, Nov. 12, 2019. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. Deadlines and additional Auditor's Office hours for this election:

- 5 p.m. Friday, Oct. 25 - Pre-Voter Registration deadline for voters for this election
 - Deadline to submit a request for an absentee ballot to be mailed
 - Oct. 25 – Postmark deadline for the original absentee request if voter e-mailed or faxed it (Auditor must receive said original request by the time the polls close on Election Day.)
 - 5 p.m. Monday, Nov. 4 - Last day to vote absentee in person at the Auditor's Office
 - Monday, Nov. 4 - Postmark deadline for absentee ballots being returned to Auditor by mail
 - 8 p.m. Nov. 5 – Voter or voter's designee may turn their absentee ballot in to the Auditor by the time the polls close on Election Day. A voter's absentee ballot may NOT be turned in to the polling place for counting.
