OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UNAPPROVED MINUTES MAY 11, 2020

Be it duly noted that these minutes of May 11, 2020 are UNOFFICIAL minutes.

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at the Franklin County Law Enforcement Center at 8:30 a.m., with Board members Michael Nolte-Chairman, Gary McVicker and Corey Eberling present.

Chairman Nolte led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves the Agenda as presented. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves the Minutes of May 4, 2020. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves Application to Work in the Right of Way for Brad Schmidt to tile about 200 feet along Cerro Gordo Street and hook into existing tile approximately 700 feet west of Indigo Avenue. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, opens Public Hearing at 9:30 a.m., to receive comments on Caribou Site Matrix expansion, owner Summit Pork II LLC, Alden, site located SW NW, Sec 7, Mott township. All ayes. Motion carried.

Comments received: Per Dan Tilkes, distance requirements have been met. No other comments were received.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, at 9:35 a.m., closes Public Hearing. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, seconded by, approves Caribou Site Site Matrix expansion, owner Summit Pork II LLC, Alden, site located SW NW, Sec 7, Mott township. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, opens at 10 a.m., a Public Hearing to hear comments on Reclassification Reports on DD#48 Total, DD#48 North, DD#48 South.

Present were: Art Cady-Drainage Attorney, Lee Gallentine-Drainage Engineer, Landowners Matt Abbas, Dave Christiansen, and Cal Dickson, Julie Pralle-Second Deputy Auditor, and Bob Goodwin-Attorney by phone.

Comments:

Lee Gallentine presented written objections from the Lemkes and the Blackfords for all three reports. Lee then reviewed the reclassification reports. Also discussed was continued sloughing problems in the drainage ditch.

Bob Goodwin-Attorney requested that he discuss objections with Lee Gallentine and Art Cady as soon as possible, and that the hearing be continued to another date in May. The Board was

agreeable to this discussion taking place during the coming week. They could not continue the hearing, but would hear all comments and questions at today's hearing, and that after discussion between the attorneys and Lee Gallentine in the coming week, they would meet again next Monday regarding this matter. Art Cady-Drainage Attorney was agreeable to this.

Matt Abbas stated he felt the interest rate charged by the county is excessive, and wanted to know if it could be reduced due to the length of time taken to settle and proceed with the reclassification. Also questioned was project cost going forward. Matt also questioned land lost to the open ditch and how this would be settled.

The Board responded that any issues pertaining to land, fences, and retainage from Rognes will need to be decided on closing.

Dave Christiansen questioned St Peters Cemetery ownership, as he is receiving drainage assessments for the cemetery. The Board answered that whichever entity owns the cemetery would be responsible for paying the drainage assessment.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, closes at 10 a.m., Public Hearing and moved to meet again next Monday, May 18, 2020 at 10:15 a.m. to consider/approve Reclassification Reports for DD#48 North, DD#48 South, and DD#48 Total. All ayes. Motion carried.

At 10:30 a.m., DD#30 Lateral 10 Investigation Summary on WO #98 was discussed.

Motion by McVicker, approves based on Lee's recommendation a Report be completed on the described area. All ayes. Motion carried.

At 11 a.m., DD#30 Lateral 30 Investigation Summary was discussed. Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling that Lee notify NRCS regarding wetlands along Highway 3 negatively impacting drainage. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves Statement of Understanding between Franklin County and Central Iowa Community Services Governing Board that will identify the individual employee, the position to be filled, and the portion of the employee's wages and benefits that will be the responsibility of the Region. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves Second Amendment to the Child Support County Staffing Contract Between the Iowa Department of Human Services, Bureau of Collections and the Floyd County (Host) Political Subdivision. All ayes. Motion carried.

The Board acknowledged Sheriff's Office Monthly Report for April 2020.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, adjourns at 11:48 a.m. All ayes. Motion carried.
