ORDINANCE NO. 393 AN ORDINANCE AFFIRMING THE CITY OF HAMPTON'S PRECINCT BOUNDARIES AFTER THE 2020 CENSUS

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Hampton, Iowa: WHEREAS, a decennial Census

was undertaken and completed by the United States Federal Census Bureau in 2020 for the City of Hampton, Franklin County, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the results of the decennial Census established the population of the City of Hampton, Franklin County, Iowa, as 4337 citizens: and

WHEREAS, the established Census figure for 2020 was an de-crease of 124 citizens from the 2010 Census established figure of 4461: and

WHEREAS, Iowa law requires Precinct boundaries be certified to the state commissioner of elections within sixty days after the redistricting of congressional and legislative districts becomes law; and

WHEREAS, the City's Precinct boundaries are not changing, however, a new ordinance is being adopted to reflect the 2020 Census results.

THEREFORE, Chapter 3, Section 3.02 shall be amended to wit: SECTION 1. TEXT AMEND-MENT. The City Code of the City of Hampton, Iowa, be and the same is hereby amended by deleting Section 3.02 in full, and replacing the

language as follows: 3.02 DIVISION INTO WARDS

City lying south of a line drawn beginning at the west corporate City limits through the center of Fourth Avenue Northwest to Tenth Street Northwest, thence south on Tenth Street Northwest to Second Avenue Northwest, thence east on Second Avenue Northwest to First Street Northwest, thence south on First Street Northwest to First Avenue Northwest, thence east on First Avenue Northwest to First Street Northeast, and, all that part of the City lying westerly of a line drawn southerly on First Street Southeast to Fourth Avenue Southeast, thence west on Fourth Avenue Southeast to Federal Street South, thence south on Federal Street South to the south corporate City limits located on 140th Street. 2. Second Ward. All that part of the City lying south of a line drawn westerly beginning at the east corporate City limits through the center of Central Avenue East to Eighth Street Northeast, thence north on Eighth Street Northeast to First Avenue Northeast, thence west on First Avenue Northeast to First Street Northeast, and, all that part of the City lying east of a line

drawn southerly on First Street Southeast to Fourth Avenue Southeast, thence west on Fourth Avenue Southeast to Federal Street South, thence south on Federal Street South to the Corporate City limits to 140th Street.

3. Third Ward. All that part of the City lying north of a line drawn westerly beginning at the east corporate City limits through the center of Central Avenue East to Eighth Street Northeast, thence north on Eighth Street Northeast to First Avenue Northeast, thence west on First Avenue Northeast to Second Street Northeast, and, all that part of the City lying east of a line drawn northerly on Second Street Northeast to Third Avenue Northeast, thence west on Third Avenue Northeast to First Street Northeast, thence north on First Street Northeast to Eleventh Place Northeast, thence west on Eleventh Place Northeast to Federal Street North, thence north on Federal Street North to Seventeenth Avenue Northeast, thence east on Seventeenth Avenue Northeast to Third Street Northeast, thence north on Third Street Northeast to Eighteenth Avenue Northeast, thence east on Eighteenth Avenue Northeast to Fourth Street Northeast, thence north on Fourth Street Northeast to the corporate City limits

4. Fourth Ward. All that part of the City lying north of a line drawn beginning at the west corporate City limits through the center of Fourth Avenue Northwest to Tenth Street Northwest thence south on Tenth Street Northwest to Second Avenue Northwest, thence east on Second Avenue Northwest to First Street Northwest, thence south on First Street Northwest to First Avenue Northwest thence east on First Avenue Northwest to Second Street Northeast, and, all that part of the City lying west of a line drawn northerly on Second Street Northeast to Third Avenue Northeast, thence west on Third Avenue Northeast to First Street North-

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY

CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

10 - West Mott - The unincorporated portion of Mott Township beginning at Quail Avenue and traveling west to the township boundary.
