The Hampton City Council Session was called to order at the Hampton City Council Chambers by Mayor Russell Wood at 6:00 p.m. Council members in attendance were Patrick Palmer, Bill Hodge, Richard Lukensmeyer, James Davies, Barry Lamos, and Steve Birdsall. Mayor Wood invited those present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. flag. Mayor Wood called for a motion to approve the agenda. Motion by Hodge. Second by Lukensmeyer to approve the agenda. Motion approved unanimously. Council Workshop report: Mayor Wood presented the Monday, March 21, 2022 minutes. Public Comment for items on the agenda: None. Public Hearings: None. Old Business: None. New Business: City Manager Dunt presented construction documents and specifications to be released for public bid for the Hampton City Hall Renovation. Motion by Palmer, seconded by Lamos to approve documents and specifications to be released for public bid for the Hampton City Hall renovation. Discussion: questions regarding pre-bid meeting, duct cleaning and HVAC. Motion approved unanimously. Dunt presented Mayor Wood's resignation letter and explained the council needs to consider options for filling the vacancy. The vacancy can be filled by appointment by

council or through a special election. A special election would come at a cost to taxpayers. Motion by Lukensmeyer, seconded by Birdsall to acknowledge Mayor Wood's resignation letter and fill the vacancy by appointment through an application process. Applications will be accepted between March 25, 2022 and April 18, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. with interviews to be held on April 25, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. and appointment to be made on May 12, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. Discussion: clarification that the Mayor application may be submitted by any U. S. citizen of Hampton at least the age of 18. Motion approved unanimously. Dunt asked for formal acceptance of the Kick it Forward plan to install a 40' x 74' mini-pitch soccer structure in Progress Park. Motion by Lamos, seconded by Davies to approve moving forward with accepting private donation of 40' x 74' mini pitch soccer structure to be installed in Progress Park. Motion approved unanimously. Approval of claims. Motion by Lukensmeyer, second by Hodge to approve the claims as submitted by Staff in the amount of \$97,367.45. Discussion: question on diesel purchases. Motion approved unanimously. Consideration of Approval and Adoption of the Ordinances/Resolutions: City Manager Dunt presented Ordinance 394: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 65 OF THE HAMPTON MUNICIPAL CODE OF 2017 BY ADDITIONAL FOUR-WAY STOP INTERSECTION. Motion by Lukensmeyer,

seconded by Davies to approve the first reading of Ordinance No. 394. Discussion: comments that public comments are encouraged prior to all 3 readings of the ordinance, the safety concerns of the intersection in question, crash data and potential unintended consequences of traffic issues in the vicinity of the Fareway parking lot entrance that may be caused by this ordinance. Roll call vote: Birdsall, Lukensmeyer, Lamos, Hodge, Davies and Palmer. Nays: None. First reading of Ordinance 394 approved. Consent Agenda: Motion by Birdsall, second by Lamos to approve the Consent Agenda including: Previous minutes as drafted from the Thursday, March 10, 2022, previous minutes as drafted from the Monday, March 14, 2022 Special Session, schedule the next Regular Session for Thursday, April 14, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. Motion approved unanimously. Public Comment for items not on the agenda: Mayor Wood invited those wishing to make public comment to address the Council regarding items not on the agenda. Jerre Grefe, owner of 1st and 2nd Vintage retail store downtown stated that her motivation is to help make Hampton a better community and expressed her gratitude for the efforts that have been put forth to help cleanup downtown thus far. She also expressed her frustrations with the ongoing garbage/cardboard/dumpsters/cigarette but issues in downtown. She presented photos of blowing cardboard, overflowing dumpsters and smokers in downtown Hampton. She requests the city review garbage/cardboard/dumpster ordinances and discuss potential solutions to the problem. The garbage ordinance will be placed on a council workshop agenda. No further public comments. Staff Reports given by Police Chief Schaefer, Public Works Director Doug Tarr and City Manager Ron Dunt. Compost Site will open April 1, 2022 pending weather. Council Reports given by Davies, Lamos, Palmer, Birdsall and Hodge. Mayors Report. Mayor Wood encouraged citizens to submit an application for mayor appointment. The Board of Supervisors met at 8:30AM on Monday, March 21st, 2021, at the Franklin County Courthouse with Board members Nolte, McVicker, & Vanness in attendance. Chairman McVicker led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Vanness, seconded by Nolte to approve the Agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Nolte, seconded by Vanness to approve the Board Minutes from the regular meeting dated 3/14/22. All ayes. Motion carried.

Public Comment & Board Committee Updates: Sheldon Jurgens from Sheffield was present to make a few comments on the proposed wind energy ordinance. Tony Vaughn from Alliant Energy was also present with a few questions and comments regarding the proposed wind energy ordinance. Nolte attended D-CAT. Vanness attended Conservation and FCDA. McVicker attended Franklin County Tourism.

Jay Waddingham, County Engineer, met with the Board and gave an update on his department.

Motion by Vanness, seconded by Nolte to open the Public Hearing regarding FY22 Budget Amendment at 9:30AM. All ayes. Motion carried. The Auditor went through the amendment with the Board. There was no comment from the public. Motion by Nolte, seconded by Vanness to close the public hearing at 9:38AM. All ayes. Motion carried.

Representatives from Indigo Wind – Apex Clean Energy (Corey Eberling & Holly McCoy) met with the Board regarding some of the discussed and proposed wind energy ordinances.

A Department Head meeting was held at 10:00AM. Full details may be obtained from the Auditor's Office.

A joint meeting was held with Wright County Board of Supervisors regarding DD2-100, work order #184. More information can be obtained from the drainage clerk or on the county website.

The Board met with representatives from the Franklin County Gun Club (Sean Esty, Dave Rush, & Les Ballard) regarding a Use Contract for the Hansell Shooting Range. A few small changes will be made and brought to the Board at the next meeting for approval and signing.

Justin Stotts from North Iowa Regional Housing Authority met with the Board to ask them to reconsider their decision regarding their payment in lieu of taxes request. He explained the entire relationship and process. After further discussion, Motion by Vanness, seconded by McVicker to reconsider last weeks motion and waive the PILOT program for the next year. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Nolte, seconded by Vanness to establish Monday, April 4th at 10:00AM at the Franklin County Law Enforcement Center for the 1st Reading and Public Hearing on Proposed Ordinance Amending Franklin County Ordinance 6.1 "Zoning Regulations" and the Addition of Ordinance 6.1, Section 7 "Wind Energy Conversion Systems". All ayes. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the resolution authorizing the issuance of the 2015A Bonds, the County reserved the right to call part or all of the 2015A Bonds for optional early redemption on June 1, 2020 or on any date thereafter, on terms of par and accrued interest; and

WHEREAS, it has been proposed that the Board authorize the redemption (the "Redemption") of the remaining outstanding maturities (the "Outstanding Maturities") of the 2015A Bonds on June 1, 2022 (the "Redemption Date"); NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Franklin County, Iowa, as follows: Section 1. UMB Bank, n.a., as Registrar and Paying Agent for the 2015A Bonds, is hereby authorized to take all action necessary to call the Outstanding Maturities for early redemption on the Redemption Date. UMB Bank, n.a. is further authorized and directed to give notice of such redemption by sending notice by registered mail, or such other means as may be acceptable to the registered owners of the 2015A Bonds, to the registered owners of the Call Maturity to be redeemed at the addresses shown on the County's registration books, not less than thirty (30) days prior to the Redemption Date.

Section 2. All resolutions and orders or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this resolution, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law.
