Audrey Emery, Human Resource Director, met with the Board to update them on the county's voluntary dental insurance plan and possible changes. After brief discussion, Motion by Nolte, seconded by Vanness to change to a dental plan with pediatric orthodontics. All ayes. Motion

Motion by Nolte, seconded by Vanness to open the Public Hearing Pertaining to Proposed Ordinance Amending 6.1 "Zoning Regulations" and the Addition of Ordinance 6.1, Section 7 "Wind Energy Conversion Systems – 1st Reading" at 10:00AM. All ayes. Motion carried. The board heard from 12 different residents and representatives of wind companies. Motion by Nolte, seconded by Vanness to close the public hearing at 10:31AM. All
