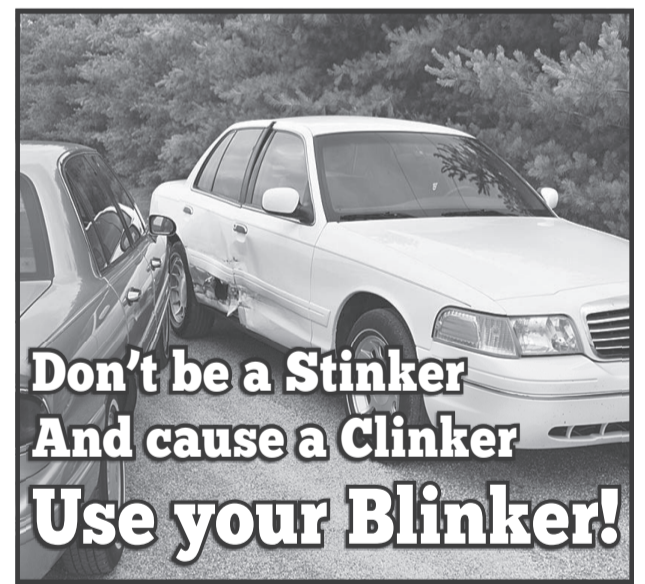

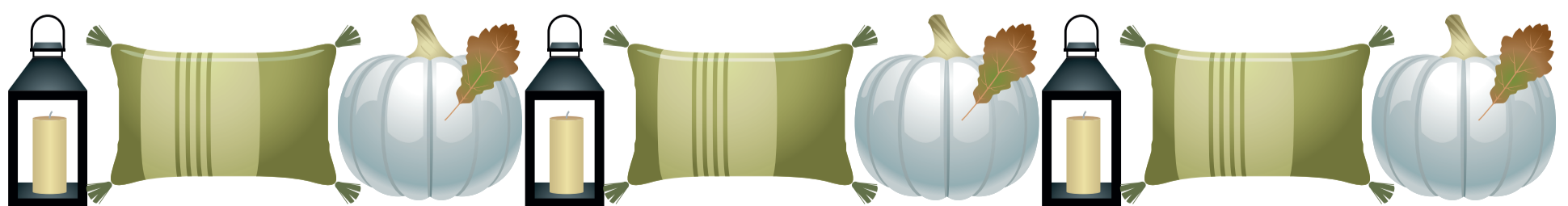

The Hampton City Council Regular Session Meeting was called to order at the Franklin County LEC by Mayor Steve Birdsall at 6:00 p.m. Council members in attendance were James Davies, Jerre Grefe, Bill Hodge, Barry Lamos (Zoom), Richard Lukensmeyer and Patrick Palmer. Mayor Birdsall invited those present to join in the Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. flag. Mayor Birdsall called for a motion to approve the agenda. Motion by Lukensmeyer. Second by Grefe to approve the agenda. Motion approved unanimously.

Council Workshop report: Minutes from the November 7, 2022 council workshop session were presented.

Public Comment: Katy Flint, Hampton, expressed her concerns of the condition of 11th St SE. She presented photos of deteriorated condition of the gravel. She requested the city maintain and grade the street regularly. Terry Schwebke, Hampton, thanked Doug Tarr and the city employees for their hard work on preparing the East Park playground area.

Public Hearings: None. Old Business: None.

New Business: City Manager Dunt presented pay application #5 from Peterson Construction for City Hall Renovation project in the amount of \$75,122.24. Motion by Lukensmeyer, seconded by Palm-

er to approve pay application #5. Motion approved unanimously.

City Manager Dunt presented Change Order #4 from SVPA for City Hall Renovation project. Motion by Davies, second by Lukensmeyer to approve change order #4. Motion carried unanimously.

City Manager Dunt presented Certificate of Substantial Completion #1 from SVPA for City Hall Renovation project. Motion by Grefe, second by Hodge to approve Certificate of Substantial Completion #1 from SVPA for City Hall Renovation project. Motion approved unanimously.

Mayor Birdsall called for a motion to approve a dog park site on Olive Avenue North of the water treatment plant. City Manager Dunt stated that the land would remain owned by the city but the dog park committee can commence with their fund raising efforts with this location designated. Motion by Palmer, second by Davies to approve a dog park site on Olive Avenue North of the water treatment plant. 5 ayes in favor, 1 nay opposed (Hodge). Motion approved.

Lukensmeyer was recently elected to the Franklin County Supervisors Board.

Mayor's Report given by Mayor Birdsall, thanking Councilman Lukensmeyer for his service to the city and wished him well in his new position as Supervisor.



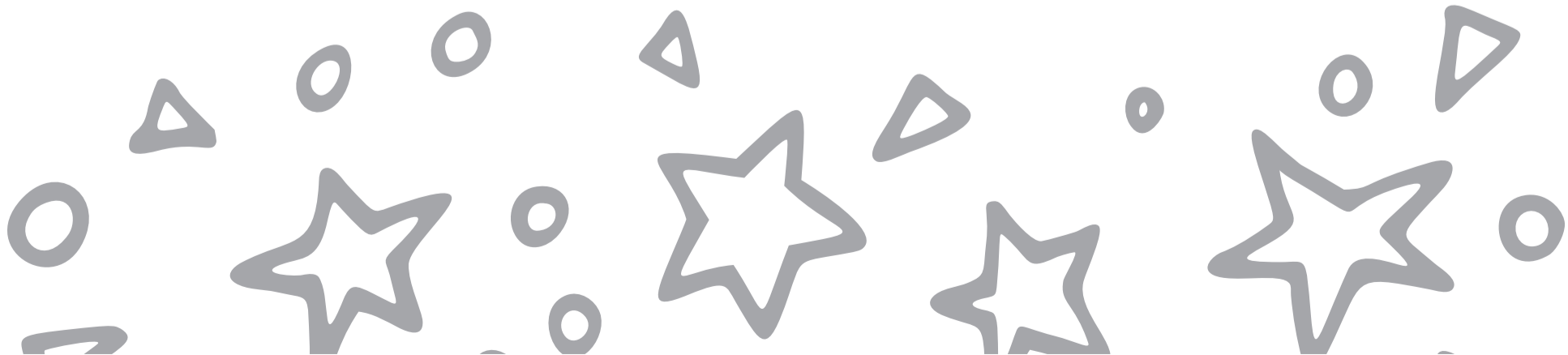

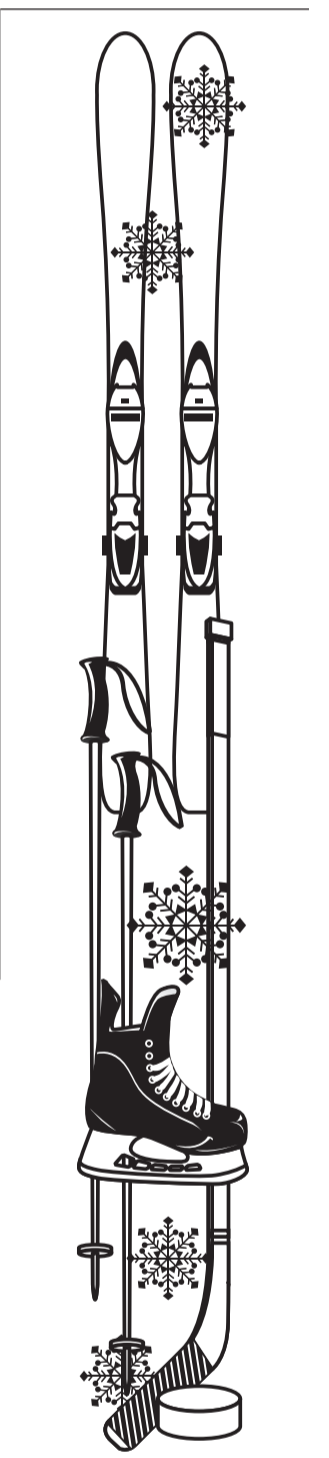
