OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UNAPPROVED MINUTES JUNE 8, 2020

Be it duly noted these minutes of June 8, 2020 are UNOFFICIAL minutes.

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 8:30 a.m., with Board members Michael Nolte-Chairman, Gary McVicker via Zoom and Corey Eberling present.

Chairman Nolte led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves the Agenda as presented. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, approves the Minutes of June 1, 2020. All ayes. Motion carried.

No one from the public was present.

Committee updates: 43 North Iowa Meeting (fka NIVC); DECAT Empowerment budgets; Conservation updates on land sale and ISU Extension, Prairie Land Trail

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves an Application to Mow and Bale within Franklin County Highway Right-of-Way to Dennis Vanness to mow on S14 from Alexander to two miles south and north two miles, 190th Street from Alexander east 4 miles, Grouse Avenue 1 mile north and south of 190th Street, 180th Street between Balsam and Wright Avenue. All ayes, motion carried.

Lisa Mulford, Planning & Zoning, submitted a Sub-Division Waiver request for Murrel Symens to enlarge and split parcels of farm ground, and existing building sites with no change of the usage. The Zoning Board, after reviewing, recommends this waiver to the Board of Supervisors.

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Eberling, per the recommendations of Planning and Zoning, adopts Resolution 2020-37, it reads as follows:

FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS APPROVING A SUBDIVISION WAIVER TO MURREL SYMENS

WHEREAS, The Franklin County Subdivision Ordinance 6.2 allows waivers to the requirements set therein, and

WHEREAS, Murrel Symens requests to divide Parcel F in SW ¼, Section 30, Ingham Township;

WHEREAS, the division does create more than 2 parcels in the SW ¼, Section 30, Ingham Township;

WHEREAS, the intent of the division is to survey the farm and allocate specific parcels among family members.

BE IT RESOLVED that The Franklin County Board of Supervisors approve the Subdivision Waiver request from Murrel Symens as presented at the Board meeting on June 8, 2020.

Lee Gallentine-Drainage Engineer CGA presented DD #48 Change Order #9 increasing the previous Change Order balance. Also present was Colette Bruns, Drainage Clerk

Motion by Eberling, seconded by McVicker, approves DD #48 Main Open Ditch, Change Order #9, per Drainage Engineer recommendation. Said Change Order #9 increases expenses by \$33,927.50 to install rip-rap due to weeping and sluffed areas in the main open ditch. The said drainage district will purchase the materials (\$33,927.50) and the Contractor, Rognes Bros. Excavating, Inc. will install at no charge. Said rip-rap to be installed no later than July 15, 2020. All ayes, motion carried.

Supervisor Eberling excused himself from the Board meeting at 11:25 AM due to a scheduled NIACOG Executive Board meeting.

At 12 p.m., the Board canvassed votes cast at the June 2, 2020 Primary Election.
